

HILLYARD FESTIVAL CELEBRATES 100 YEARS!

The Hillyard Festival is celebrating its 100th anniversary this August 5th, 6th and 7th. To honor the centennial of this community celebration the City of Spokane, Spokane County, and the Governor of the State of Washington have declared the weekend "Hillyard Festival Days." A short ceremony attended by the Mayor and representatives of Spokane County and Governor Gregoire's office is scheduled to read and present these proclamations at 4:30 p.m. in Harmon Park. The public is invited to attend the ceremony and share in this historic honor for Hillyard.

Each day of our centennial celebration has a theme all its own. We kick off the festival with "Seniors Day" at noon on Friday along with opening Lion's Bingo and enjoying some easy listening by musical talents like Tommy G., Jerry Unruh, and Brad Keeler. After the proclamation ceremony the Hillyard Belles perform their '20 Vaudeville act followed by an evening with Blissterz and Hung Phat. Saturday, "Cen-

tenial Day", begins at 7:00 a.m. with a free breakfast (donation appreciated) served until 10:00 a.m. at the New Beginnings Community Resource Center, 2524 E Queen. The Hi-Jinks Parade starts at 10:00 a.m. and marches north on Market Street to Harmon Park. Immediately following, the Hot Rods in Hillyard Car Show will run south, back down the parade route into downtown Hillyard, for a Car Show.

In the Park you'll find a variety of food and craft vendors interspersed with community organizations and a political candidate here and there. Free entertainment throughout the day includes Johnathan Jones, Just Joeken, Electric City, and Steve Starky. The evening headliner is Soul Proprietor at 8:30, followed by Hillyard's largest fireworks display ever.

Sunday is "Family Day." A multidenominational church service beginning at 10:00 a.m. draws hundreds of worshipers every year. At 12:30 p.m. Ce-

cil Lewis, a popular Magician, is scheduled to awe and amaze us followed by a Tae Kwon Do demonstration at 1:30 and local favorite band Armed and Dangerous (formerly Nighthawk) beginning at 3:00 p.m. until the Festival closes at Five.

For the first time credit card options are available through the Hillyard Festival Association booth. Commemorative "Hillyard Centennial" wooden coins will be sold at the HFA booth for \$3. These may be purchased with cash or your credit card and used to purchase goods at participating vendors booths or the Beer Garden, open throughout the Festival.
